Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. It is a Feast which is celebrated with the Solemnity of Sunday marking the end of the Easter Octave.

The readings during these First Eight Days of the Easter Solemnity are remarkable by divine appearances and revelation of the Risen Lord.

Thanks to John Paul II who gave the church this Feast in recognition of the apparitions of Sister Faustyna Kowalska. Both are saints today.

In the appearance of Jesus to his disciples this Sunday's gospel, he reveals the Extraordinary Mercy of God. Mercy, so divine and inexhaustible.

Only if we understood how merciful God is to us individually, we would become the instruments of peace and reconciliation.
