Gospel

Blessed are the poor in spirit.

Following last Sunday's gospel on Jesus, who started his ministry around the region and territory of Galilee, it is geographically fitting to be presented with the sermon on the mount this Sunday which is believed to have taken place near Capernaum, in the same region.

How can one preach or reflect on the sermon of Jesus? What can we add or remove? It is a clear message that speaks for itself. Yet, it is not as simple as it may seem. How can the poor be happy? Who could ever be happy in the midst of persecution and sorrow of any kind?

The very Church of the Beatitudes near Galilee is incredibly modern. But at the same time, it takes you back to the simplicity of that very spot where Jesus sat, surrounded by the people who listened to his teaching, which made a deep impression. This church has eight windows, which represent the eight Beatitudes of our Christian attitudes. Each window symbolises our different reflection of Christ's Light and Good News to the world and becomes the windows through which the world sees Christ in us.

It is not about what we have or lack; it is not about what we do and what happens to us. It is about our attitude to the circumstances of everyday life. That's what makes us Christians and distinguishes saints from sinners.
