This sums up the story of Jeremiah this Sunday. He got into trouble because he dared to do good. He spoke the truth in defence of justice. Justice for the poor and oppressed. What follows it was a conspiracy to have him condemned and thrown down the miry pit. But that was not the end of the story; he was vindicated through one just man, Ebed-Melech (A foreign Servant of the King).

Jeremiah symbolised the suffering of Christ, the just one, who would be condemned to death, but God would raise him up after three days in vindication of truth and justice.

Jesus says he has not come to bring peace that the world is comfortable with. His peace is the true peace that is founded on justice, making the unjust, uncomfortable.

If you want to do good; If you want to change the system for good; be ready to go through the baptism of fire. It won't be easy, but Truth and Justice will have the final victory.
