Gospel

When Jesus was baptised, he saw the Spirit of God coming to rest on him.

Today is the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This is the last day of Christmas and begins the first week of the Church's liturgical year. Christ is the beginning and the end of all that we have and are as Christians.

St Matthew, in his own account of the baptism of the Lord, points out the humble gesture of Jesus Christ approaching John the Baptist to be baptised. John initially hesitates to baptise the very author of baptism, but Jesus insists. By that very act, Jesus leads his followers by example.

Baptism is the gateway to all the sacraments in the church. We are all welcomed through the door of the church during baptism.

In this important journey of faith, along other members of the Christian household, we are nourished and supported by other sacraments to remain true witnesses of Christ in the church and the world. We become the light that we share from the Paschal Light. We are anointed to be priests, prophets, and kings.

Let us be reminded, at every step of this journey, the very words of baptismal confirmation: "You are my beloved son and daughter; my favour is upon you."
