THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS

1st Reading

It has been decided by the Spirit and by ourselves not to saddle you with any burden beyond these essentials.

2nd Reading

He showed me the holy city coming down out of heaven.

Gospel

A peace the world cannot give is my gift to you.

The vision of John in Revelation 21 and 22 which we hear about in today's second reading paints a beautiful image of Jerusalem, the City of God. It is a city magnificently established on a hill top. It radiates with great light shining for all others to see. There are twelve gates. On these gates are inscribed the names of the twelve tribes of Israel. It is a place where every tribe and tongue and nation is envisioned to be represented.

It is the vision of the people of God, the Church, where everyone finds a home.

St Peter's Basilica welcomes millions of pilgrims and tourists every year. And so should every church in cities, towns and villages of the world welcome anyone who comes seeking God. We may not see the names of the ancient tribes of Israel on the pillars of the Vatican or walls of our churches; but the twelve apostles who are the foundation of the Church remind us constantly the universality of the church.

Acts of the Apostles 15 we read today reminds us of the continued challenge we have as a church to be open and inclusive in our evangelical and mission approach.

The Gospel of John speaks again about love. Love opens us to hear God's word and keep it; that God may come to make a home in us. Love is the new circumcision.

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW & DO WHEN COMING TO MASS.

- 1. Everyone in the church is highly encouraged to wear face masks.
