Gospel Who is my neighbour? Orderliness makes life a little less stressful. It takes good leadership and followership to manage the chaos when it does happen.

If Moses had a unique leadership skill, it would have been his constant encouragement of the people to listen to the one and only trustworthy voice of order - the Lord God.

But this law he says is not far from us. It is in our hearts and minds and on our lips.

St Paul acknowledges God's closeness to us in the person of Jesus Christ – the true image of the unseen God.

In the Gospel, Jesus explains the practical observance of God's law in the love of God and our neighbour.

But who is my neighbour? What do they look like? What's their religion? What's their status? What's their address and postcode? According to the story of the good Samaritan, my neighbour is anyone in need of my love and compassion.
