The end of the year comes with its own pressure to tidy up, especially the unfinished business of the year. Tidying up is accountability. It is taking responsibility to round off what we have begun. In the spiritual sense, it is judgement. The day of reckoning.

Not everyone wants to hear that word - judgement. Poor or rich, no one wants to be judged. No one wants to be told off in the end. But it is simple. If we do not want to be judged harshly in the end, we still have time to put one or two things right. That is the purpose of the end time warning. It is not to frighten us. It is that warning bell, to think of what we need to amend while we still have the time. The Prophet Malachi says, 'The day is coming now, burning like a furnace.' We often think we have all the time in the world to prepare to meet the Lord. We don't. And the time is now. Time flies and we fly with it. St Paul warns against people who are idle in waiting. He would encourage people of this kind to go on earning the food they eat and stop interfering in other people's lives.

St Luke asks us to wait in hope rather than wait in fear and anxiety. So many strange things are happening, and more are still to come but we should be calm. To be calm is to trust in the Lord who is coming to save us.
